

# ORDINANCE NO. 111

## TEXAS MUNICIPAL RETIREMENT SYSTEM

**AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE PARTICIPATION IN THE TEXAS MUNICIPAL RETIREMENT SYSTEM AND THE SUPPLEMENTAL DEATH BENEFITS FUND BY THE CITY OF THOMPSONS, TEXAS; AND TO MAKE CURRENT SERVICE AND PRIOR SERVICE CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE CITY'S ACCOUNT IN THE MUNICIPAL ACCUMULATION FUND OF THE TEXAS MUNICIPAL RETIREMENT SYSTEM AT THE ACTUARIALLY DETERMINED RATE OF TOTAL EMPLOYEE COMPENSATION.**

**WHEREAS**, Subtitle G of Title 8 of the Government Code, as amended (herein after referred to as the "TMRS ACT"), relating to the Texas Municipal Retirement System (the "System"), authorizes the governing body of each city or town to elect, at its option, to have one or more of the city departments participate in such System; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Thompsons, Texas, finds that it will be in the public interest for the City to have its employees participate in the System as hereinafter provided; now, therefore,

### **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THOMPSONS, TEXAS:**

**Section 1.** The City Council of the City of Thompsons, Texas, on behalf of said City, hereby exercises its option and elects to have this City and all of the employees of all departments now existing and those hereafter created participate in the System as provided in the TMRS Act.

**Section 2.** The Mayor is hereby directed to notify the Board of Trustees of the System that this City has elected to participate and have the employees of this City covered in said System.

**Section 3.** Each person who becomes an employee of this City on or after the effective date of participation of this City whose position shall require more than 1,000 hours per year shall become a member of the System as a condition of their employment.

**Section 4.** Each employee of this City who is a member of the System is eligible to retire and receive a service retirement annuity if the member has at least 20 years of credited service in the System performed for one or more municipalities that have adopted a like provision under Section 854.202(g) of the TMRS Act.

**Section 5.** In accordance with the provisions of the TMRS Act, the deposits to be made to the System on account of current service of the employees of the several participating departments are hereby fixed at the rate of 5%(percent) of the full earnings of each employee of said departments.

**Section 6.** Each employee who qualifies for such credit shall be allowed "prior service credit" (as defined in Section 853.101 of the TMRS Act) at the rate of 100% (percent) of the "base credit" of such member, calculated in the manner prescribed in Section 853.105 of said Act.

**Section 7.** For each month of current service rendered to this City by each of its employees who are members of the System, the City will contribute to the current service annuity reserve of each such member at the time of his or her retirement, a sum that is 100% (percent) of such member's accumulated deposits for such month of employment; and said sum shall be contributed from this City's account in the municipality accumulation fund.

**Section 8.** The City Secretary is hereby directed to remit to the Board of Trustees of the System, at its office in Austin, Texas, the city contributions to the System and the amounts which shall be deducted from the compensation or payroll of employees, all as required by said Board under the provisions of the TMRS Act, and the said official is hereby authorized and directed to ascertain and certify officially on behalf of this City the prior service rendered to the said municipality by each of the employees of the participating departments, and the average prior service compensation received by each of the employees of the participating departments and make and execute all prior service certifications and all other reports and certifications which may be required of the City under the provisions of the TMRS Act, or in compliance with the rules and regulations of the Board of Trustees of the System.

**Section 9.** The City hereby elects to participate in the Supplemental Death Benefits Fund of the System for the purpose of providing in-service death benefits for each of this City's employees who are members of said System, and for the purpose of providing post-retirement death benefits for annuitants whose last covered employment was as an employee of this City, in the amounts and on the terms provided for in Sections 852.004, 854.601 through 854.605, 855.314, 855.408, and 855.502 of Title 8 Subtitle G, of the Texas Government Code, as amended.

**Section 10.** The City is hereby authorized and directed to notify the Director of the System of adoption of this ordinance, and of the participation of this City in said Fund.

**Section 11.** Pursuant to Section 855.407(g) of the TMRS Act, the City hereby elects to make future normal and prior service contributions to its account in the municipal accumulation fund of the System at such combined rate of the total compensation paid by this City to employees who are members of the System, as the System's actuary shall annually determine as the rate necessary to fund, within the

amortization period determined as applicable to this City under the TMRS Act, the costs of all benefits which are or may become chargeable to or are to be paid out of this City's account in said accumulation fund, regardless of other provisions of the TMRS Act limiting the combined rate of City contributions.

**Section 12.** The provisions of this ordinance shall become effective on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January, 2004.

FISCAL YEAR 5-1-04 THROUGH 4-30-05**

**WHEREAS, pursuant to the laws of the State of Texas for General Law cities, the budget covering proposed expenditures for the fiscal year beginning May 1, 2004 and ending April 30, 2005 was filed with the City Secretary and was posted in Herald Coaster and bulletin board outside City Hall as required; and**

**WHEREAS, a public hearing was held by the City Council of Aldermen of the Town of Thompsons, Texas, on said budget on February 19, 2004, at which time said budget was fully considered, and interested taxpayers were heard by City Council;**

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUCIL OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF THOMPSONS, TEXAS:**

**ORDINANCE NUMBER 113A**

AN ORDINANCE DECLEARING EACH UNOPPOSED CANDIDATE ELECTED TO OFFICE:

WHEREAS: under Subchapter C, ("Election of Unopposed Candidate"), Section 2.051-2.054 of the Election Code of the State of Texas:

CHAPTER 2 SUBCHAPTER C VERNON'S TEXAS CODES ANNOTATED  
ELECTIONS

ELECTION OF UNOPPOSED CANDIDATE

SECTION 2.051: APPLICABILITY OF SUBCHAPTER. This subchapter applies only to an election for officers of a political subdivision other than a county in which write-in votes may be counted only for names appearing on a list of write in candidates and in which:

- (1) each candidate whose name is to appear on the ballot is unopposed;
- and
- (2) no proposition is to appear on the ballot.

SECTION 2.052: CERTIFICATION OF UNOPPOSED STATUS. (a) The authority responsible for having the official ballot prepared shall certify in writing that a candidate is unopposed for election to an office in:

- (1) only one candidate's name is to be placed on the ballot for that office under Section 52.003; and
  - (2) no candidate's name is to be placed on a list of write-in candidates for that office under applicable law.
- (b.) The certification shall be delivered to the governing body of the political subdivision as soon as possible after the filing deadline for placement on the ballot and a list of write-in candidates.

SECTION 2.053: ACTION ON CERTIFICATION: (a) On receipt of the certification, the governing body of the political subdivision by order or ordinance may declare each unopposed candidate elected to office.

(b) If a declaration is made under Subsection (a), the election is not held. A copy of the order or ordinance shall be posted on election day at each polling place that would have been used in the election.

© A certificate of election shall be issued to each candidate in the same manner as provided for a candidate elected at the election.

WHEREAS; as certification has been delivered to the governing body of the Town of Thompsons, Fort Bend County, Texas by the City Secretary stating that there are no opposed candidates and that no proposition is to appear on the ballot.

WHEREAS: all criteria have been met under the Texas Election Code, the Mayor and Aldermen of the Town of Thompsons, Fort Bend County, Texas declare the following unopposed candidate are duly elected to the position listed:

Mayor: Freddie Newsome, Jr.  
Alderman: Sherrie Knoepfel  
Alderman: Marion Garcia

WHEREAS: If any provision, section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance, or application of same to any person or set of circumstances, is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, void, invalid (or for any reason unenforceable), the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance or their application to other persons or sets of circumstances shall not be affected thereby, it being the intent of the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Thompsons in adopting this ordinance, that no portion thereof or provision or regulation contained herein shall become inoperative or fail by reason of any unconstitutionality or invalidity of any portion, provision or regulation, and to this end, all provisions of this ordinance are declared to be severable.

WHEREAS: Any ordinance or parts of ordinances in conflict: herewith, are repealed to the extent of their conflict only.

NOW THEREFORE BE ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF THOMPSONS, FORT BEND COUNTY, TEXAS: the fact in the preamble of this ordinance are hereby found and determined to be true and correct and this Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage and adoption.

The Town Secretary is hereby directed to keep a file of this ordinance with the City files.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval. Passed and adopted following the first reading hereof this 15<sup>th</sup> day of April, A.D., 2004.

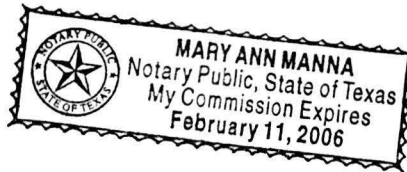

ELECTIONS

ELECCION DE CANDIDATO SIN OPOSICION

SECCION 2.051: APLICABILIDAD DE SUBCAPITULO. Este subcapitulo aplica solamente a una eleccion para oficiales de una subdivision politico otra cosa que un condado en que votos de escrito pueden estar contado solamente para nombres que aparecen en un lista que esta escrito de candidatos y en que:

- (1) Cada candidato que su nombre aparece en la balota es sin oposicion; y
- (2) No proporcion es de aparecer en la balota.

SECCION 2.052: CERTIFICACION DE CONDICION SIN OPOSICION.

- (a) La autoridad responsable de tener labalota preparado oficial para formar certificar en escrito que el candidato es sin oposicion para el eleccion de un oficio en:
  - (1) Solamente uno candidato's nombre estar puesto en la balota por esa oficio en seccion 52.003; y
  - (2) No candidato's nombre es puesto en la lista de candidatos escrito para el oficio aplicable de la ley.
- (b) El certificacion habre estado entregado a la cuerpo de gobernar de un subdivision politico lo mas pronto posible despues del solicitado linea vedada para colocacion en la balota y una lista de candidatos escrito.

SECCION 2.053: ACCION DE CERTIFICACION:

- (a) En ricibo de certificacion, el cuerpo de gobenar de un subdivision de orden o ordenanza puede declarar cada candidato sin oposicion para elegido a la oficio.
- (b) Si una declaracion es inventado en subseccion (a), no hay elecciones. Una copia del orden or ordenanza sera puesto en el dia de eleccion a cada cabina de votar que fue usado en la eleccion.
- (c) Un certificacion de eleccion sera dado para cada candidato en el mismo manera a condicion para un candidato electado a la elecciones.

## **ORDINANCE #118**

### **ESTABLISHING AN EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PROGRAM**

**An ordinance establishing a program of comprehensive emergency management; acknowledging the office of Emergency Management Director; authorizing the appointment of an Emergency Management Coordinator; and providing for the duties and responsibilities of those offices; identifying an operational organization; granting necessary powers to cope with all phases of emergency management which threaten life and property in the City of Thompsons; authorizing cooperative and mutual aid agreements for relief work between this and other cities and counties and for related purposes.**

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of Thompsons finds that the identification of potential hazards and the prevention or mitigation of their effects must be an on-going concern of the County if the lives and property of the populace are to be protected; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council declares that the preparation of a Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan, and the means for it's implementation, for the protection of lives and property in the City of Thompsons from natural or man-caused disasters or threat thereof is immediately essential; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council further finds that in times of disasters which may imperil the safety of the inhabitants of the County, or their property, it becomes necessary to effectuate and place into operation the preconceived plans and preparations with a minimum of delay; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council finds, therefore, that the preparation, and implementation of such plans are now imperative; **be it ordered, adjudged and decreed by the City Council of the City of Thompsons, Texas:**

#### **Section 1. ORGANIZATION**

There exists the office of Emergency Management Director of the City of Thompsons, which shall be held by the Mayor in accordance with state law.

- (a) An Emergency Management Coordinator may be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the Director;
- (b) The Director shall be responsible for a program of comprehensive emergency management within the City and for carrying out the duties and responsibilities set forth in this ordinance. He/she may delegate authority for execution of these duties to the coordinator, but ultimate responsibility for such execution shall remain with the Director.

- (c) The operational Emergency Management organization of the City of Thompsons shall consist of the officers and employees of the City so designated by the Director in the emergency management plan, as well as organized volunteer groups. The functions and duties of this organization shall be distributed among such officers and employees in accordance with the terms of the emergency management plan.

**Section 2. EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT DIRECTOR-POWERS AND DUTIES**

The duties and responsibilities of the Emergency Management Director shall include the following:

- (a) Surveying actual or potential hazards that threaten life and property within the City and identifying and requiring or recommending the implementation of measures which would tend to prevent the occurrence or reduce the impact of such hazards if a disaster did occur.
- (b) Supervision of the development and approval of an emergency management plan for the City of Thompsons, and shall recommend for adoption by the City Council all mutual aid arrangements deemed necessary for the implementation of such plan.
- (c) Authority to declare a local state of disaster. The declaration may not be continued or renewed for a period in excess of 7 days except by or with the consent of the City Council. Any order or proclamation declaring, continuing, or terminating a local state of disaster shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be filed promptly with the City Secretary.
- (d) Issuance of necessary proclamations, regulations or directives which are necessary for carrying out the purposes of this ordinance. Such proclamations, regulations, or directives shall be disseminated promptly by means calculated to bring its contents to the attention of the general public and, unless circumstances attendant on the disaster prevent or impede, promptly filed with the City Secretary.
- (e) Direction and Control of the operations of the City of Thompsons Emergency Management organization as well as the training of emergency management personnel.
- (f) Determination of all questions of authority and responsibility that may arise within the emergency management organization of the City.
- (g) Maintenance of the liaison with other municipal, county, district, state, regional or federal emergency management organizations.

- (h) Marshaling of all necessary personnel, equipment or supplies from any department of the City to aid in the carrying out of the provisions of the emergency management plan.
- (i) Supervision of the drafting and execution of mutual aid agreements, in cooperation with the representatives of the state and of other local political subdivisions of the state, and the drafting and execution, if deemed desirable, of an agreement with the County in which said City is located in and with other municipalities within the County, for the county-wide coordination of emergency management efforts.
- (j) Supervision of, and final authorization for the procurement of all necessary supplies and equipment, including acceptance of private contributions which may be offered for the purpose of improving emergency management within the City.
- (k) Authorizing of agreements, after approval of the City Attorney, for use of private property for public shelter and other purposes.
- (l) Surveying the availability of existing personnel, equipment, supplies and services which could be used during a disaster, as provided for herein.
- (m) Other requirements as specified in the Texas Disaster Act, (Chapter 418, Government Code).

**Section 3. EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PLAN**

A comprehensive Emergency Management Plan shall be developed and maintained in a current state. The plan shall set forth the form of the organization, establish and designate divisions and functions, assign responsibilities, tasks, duties, and powers, and designate officers and employees to carry out the provisions of this order. As provided by state law, the plan shall follow the standards and criteria established by the Governor's Division of Emergency Management of the State of Texas. Insofar as possible, the form of organization, titles and terminology shall conform to the recommendations of the Governor's Division of Emergency Management. When approved, it shall be the duty of all departments and agencies to perform the functions assigned by the plan and to maintain their portion of the plan in a current state of readiness at all times. The emergency management plan shall be considered supplementary to this ordinance and have the effect of law during the time of a disaster.

**Section 4. INTERJURISDICTIONAL PROGRAM**

The Mayor is hereby authorized to join with the County Judge of Fort Bend County and the Mayors of other cities in said County in the formation of interjurisdictional emergency management program for the Fort Bend County,

and shall have the authority to cooperate in the preparation of an interjurisdictional emergency management plan as well as have all powers necessary to participate in a county-wide program of emergency management insofar as said program may affect the City of Thompsons.

**Section 5. OVERRIDE**

At all times when the orders, rules and regulations made and promulgated pursuant to this ordinance shall be in effect, they shall supercede and override all existing ordinances, orders, rules and regulations insofar as the latter may be inconsistent therewith.

**Section 6. LIABILITY**

This order is an exercise by the City of its governmental functions for the protection of the public peace, health, and safety and neither the City of Thompsons, the agents and representatives of said City, nor any individual, receiver, firm, partnership, corporation, association, or trustee, nor any of the agents thereof in good faith carrying out, complying with or attempting to comply with, any order, rule, or regulation promulgated pursuant to the provisions of this ordinance shall be liable for any damage sustained to persons as the result of said activity. Any person owning or controlling real estate or other premises who voluntarily and without compensation, grants to the City of Thompsons a license of privilege, or otherwise permits the City to inspect, designate and use the whole or any part or parts of such real estate or premises for the purpose of sheltering persons during an actual, impending or practice enemy attack or natural or man-made disaster shall, together with his successors in interest, if any, not be civilly liable for the death of, or injury to, any person on or about such real estate or premises under such license, privilege or other permission or for loss of, or damage to, the property of such person.

**Section 7. COMMITMENT OF FUNDS**

No person shall have the right to expend any public funds of the City in carrying out any Emergency Management activity authorized by this ordinance without prior approval of the City Council, nor shall any person have any right to bind the City by contract, agreement, or otherwise without prior and specific approval of the City Council unless during a declared disaster. During a declared disaster, the Mayor may expend and/or commit public funds of the City when deemed prudent and necessary for the protection of health, life, or property.

**Section 8. OFFENSES; PENALTIES**

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to willfully obstruct, hinder, or delay any member of the Emergency Management organization in

the enforcement of any rule or regulation issued pursuant to this ordinance.

- (b) It shall likewise be unlawful for any person to wear, carry or display any emblem, insignia, or any other means of identification as a member of the Emergency Management organization of City of Thompsons, unless authority to do so has been granted to such person by the proper officials.
- (c) Convictions for violations of the provisions of this order shall be punishable by fine no to exceed \_\_\_\_\_ dollars (\$\_\_\_\_\_).

**Section 9. SEVERABILITY**

If any portion of this ordinance shall, for any reason, be declared invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the remaining provisions thereof.

**Section 10. LIMITATIONS**



WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Fort Bend County finds that the identification of potential hazards and the prevention or mitigation of their effects must be an on-going concern of the County if the lives and property of the populace are to be protected; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court declares that the preparation of a Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan, and the means for its implementation, for the protection of lives and property in Fort Bend County from natural or man-caused disasters or threat thereof is immediately essential; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court further finds that in times of disasters which may imperil the safety of the inhabitants of the County, or their property, it becomes necessary to effectuate and place into operation the preconceived plans and preparations with a minimum of delay; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court finds, that the preparation, and implementation of such plans are now imperative;

**Section 1. ORGANIZATION**

There exists the office of Emergency Management Director of Fort Bend County, which shall be held by the County Judge in accordance with state law.

- (k) Authorizing of agreements, after approval of the County Attorney, for use of private property for public shelter and other purposes.
- (l) Surveying the availability of existing personnel, equipment, supplies and services which could be used during a disaster, as provided for herein.
- (m) Other requirements as specified in the Texas Disaster Act, (Chapter 418, Government Code).

**Section 3. EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PLAN**

The County Judge is hereby authorized to join with the Mayors of the cities within Fort Bend County in the formation of an Interjurisdictional Emergency Management Program for the Cities of Arcola, Beasley, Fulshear, Kendleton, Meadows Place, Needville, Orchard, Richmond, Rosenberg, Simonton and Stafford; the Villages of Fairchilds and Pleak; and the Town of Thompsons, and shall have the authority to participate in the preparation of an Interjurisdictional Emergency Management Plan and in the appointment of a joint Emergency Management Coordinator, as well as all powers necessary to participate in a county-wide program of emergency management insofar as said program may affect Fort Bend County.

**Section 5. OVERRIDE**

At all times when the orders, rules and regulations made and promulgated pursuant to this Order shall be in effect, they shall supercede and override all existing ordinances, orders, rules and regulations insofar as the latter may be inconsistent therewith.

**Section 6. LIABILITY**

This Order is an exercise by the County of its governmental functions for the protection of the public peace, health, and safety and neither Fort Bend County, the agents and representatives of said County, nor any of the agents thereof, in good faith carrying out, complying with or attempting to comply with, any order, rule, or regulation promulgated pursuant to the provisions

of this order shall be liable for any damage sustained to persons as the result of said activity. Any person owning or controlling real estate or other premises who voluntarily and without compensation, grants to Fort Bend County a license of privilege, or otherwise permits the County to inspect, designate and use the whole or any part or parts of such real estate or premises for the purpose of sheltering persons during an actual, impending or practice enemy attack or natural or man-made disaster shall, together with his successors in interest, if any, not be civilly liable for the death of, or injury to, any person on or about such real estate or premises under such license, privilege or other permission or for loss of, or damage to, the property of such person.

**Section 7. COMMITMENT OF FUNDS**

No person shall have the right to expend any public funds of the County in carrying out any Emergency Management activity authorized by this Order without prior approval by the Commissioners Court, nor shall any person have any right to bind the County by contract, agreement, or otherwise without prior and specific approval of the Commissioners Court unless during a declared disaster. During a declared disaster, the County Judge may expend and/or commit public funds of the County when deemed prudent and necessary for the protection of health, life, or property.

**Section 8. OFFENSES; PENALTIES**

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to willfully obstruct, hinder, or delay any member of the Emergency Management organization in the enforcement of any rule or regulation issued pursuant to this order.
- (b) It shall likewise be unlawful for any person to wear, carry or display any emblem, insignia, or any other means of identification as a member of the Emergency Management organization of Fort Bend County, unless authority to do so has been granted to such person by the proper officials.
- (c) Convictions for violations of the provisions of this order shall be punishable by fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500).

**Section 9. SEVERABILITY**

If any portion of this order shall, for any reason, be declared invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the remaining provisions thereof.

**Section 10. LIMITATIONS**







## JOINT RESOLUTION

### ESTABLISHING AN INTERJURISDICTIONAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

*BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED* that the Mayor of Thompsons shall appoint an Emergency Management Coordinator or designate a liaison for the Town of Thompsons to coordinate with the Fort Bend County Emergency Management Coordinator all aspects of the comprehensive emergency management program.

*BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED* that any party to this agreement may withdraw from the combined organization created by this resolution and its related interjurisdictional emergency management plan by giving sixty days advance notice in writing to each of the signatories to this resolution and to the Governor's Division of Emergency Management.

**ORDINANCE NUMBER 119A**

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING EACH UNOPPOSED CANDIDATE ELECTED TO OFFICE:

WHEREAS: under Subchapter C, ("Election of Unopposed Candidate"), Section 2.051-2.054 of the Election Code of the State of Texas:

CHAPTER 2 SUBCHAPTER C VERNON'S TEXAS CODES ANNOTATED  
ELECTIONS

ELECTION OF UNOPPOSED CANDIDATE

SECTION 2.051: APPLICABILITY OF SUBCHAPTER. This subchapter applies only to an election for officers of a political subdivision other than a county in which write-in votes may be counted only for names appearing on a list of write in candidates and in which:

- (1) each candidate whose name is to appear on the ballot is unopposed;  
and
- (2) no proposition is to appear on the ballot.

SECTION 2.052: CERTIFICATION OF UNOPPOSED STATUS. (a) The authority responsible for having the official ballot prepared shall certify in writing that a candidate is unopposed for election to an office in:

- (1) only one candidate's name is to be placed on the ballot for that office under Section 52.003; and
- (2) no candidate's name is to be placed on a list of write-in candidates for that office under applicable law.

(b.) The certification shall be delivered to the governing body of the political subdivision as soon as possible after the filing deadline for placement on the ballot and a list of write-in candidates.

SECTION 2.053: ACTION ON CERTIFICATION: (a) On receipt of the certification, the governing body of the political subdivision by order or ordinance may declare each unopposed candidate elected to office.

(b) If a declaration is made under Subsection (a), the election is not held. A copy of the order or ordinance shall be posted on election day at each polling place that would have been used in the election.

© A certificate of election shall be issued to each candidate in the same manner as provided for a candidate elected at the election.

WHEREAS; as certification has been delivered to the governing body of the Town of Thompsons, Fort Bend County, Texas by the City Secretary stating that there are no opposed candidates and that no proposition is to appear on the ballot.

WHEREAS: all criteria have been met under the Texas Election Code, the Mayor and Aldermen of the Town of Thompsons, Fort Bend County, Texas declare the following unopposed candidate are duly elected to the position listed:

Alderman: Gina S. Treadgold  
Alderman: Carol M. Gubbels

WHEREAS: If any provision, section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance, or application of same to any person or set of circumstances, is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, void, invalid (or for any reason unenforceable), the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance or their application to other persons or sets of circumstances shall not be affected thereby, it being the intent of the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Thompsons in adopting this ordinance, that no portion thereof or provision or regulation contained herein shall become inoperative or fail by reason of any unconstitutionality or invalidity of any portion, provision or regulation, and to this end, all provisions of this ordinance are declared to be severable.

WHEREAS: Any ordinance or parts of ordinances in conflict: herewith, are repealed to the extent of their conflict only.

NOW THEREFORE BE ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF THOMPSONS, FORT BEND COUNTY, TEXAS: the fact in the preamble of this ordinance are hereby found and determined to be true and correct and this Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage and adoption.

The Town Secretary is hereby directed to keep a file of this ordinance with the City files.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval. Passed and adopted following the first reading hereof this 21st day of April, A.D., 2005.

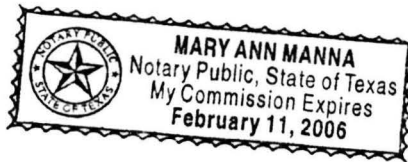

ORDINANCE NO. 120

**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF THE TML INTERGOVERNMENTAL EMPLOYEE BENEFITS POOL INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT; ADOPTING A PLAN OF HEALTH BENEFITS FOR CITY OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT; PROVIDING AN OPEN MEETINGS CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE**

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Thompsons desires to provide health benefits coverage to its officers and employees;

**WHEREAS**, TML Intergovernmental Employee Benefits Pool is a health risk pool established pursuant to Texas Local Government Code Chapter 172, Texas Government Code Chapter 791, and the Texas Trust code to provide health benefits coverage for officers and employees of Texas political subdivisions under an Interlocal agreement;

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Thompsons desires to provide health benefits coverage to its officers and employees through the TML Intergovernmental Employee Benefits Pool and to enter into an Interlocal agreement for that purpose;

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Thompsons desires to select a plan of benefits for its officers and employees to be provided by the TML Intergovernmental Employee Benefits Pool; and

**WHEREAS**, executing the TML Intergovernmental Employee Benefits Pool Interlocal Agreement is in the best interest of the Town of Thompsons, its officers and employees, and the public generally;

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN OF THOMPSONS COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF THOMPSONS THAT:**

**SECTION 1:** The foregoing recitals are incorporated into this Ordinance as findings of fact.

**SECTION 2:** The Town of Thompsons hereby elects to join the TML Intergovernmental Employee Benefits Pool by executing the Pool's Interlocal Agreement.

**SECTION 3:** The Town of Thompsons hereby adopts the following benefit plans to be provided to its officers and employees through the TML Intergovernmental Employee Benefits Pool:

Medical, Dental, Vision & Life Insurance  
The benefit plan herein adopted are attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein for all purposes.

**SECTION 4:** Mayor is hereby authorized to execute the TML Intergovernmental Employee Benefits Pool Interlocal Agreement on behalf of the Town of Thompsons.

**SECTION 5:** The Town of Thompsons Secretary is hereby ordered to enter a copy of this Ordinance in the Town of Thompsons minutes.

**SECTION 6:** All existing Town of Thompsons ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are repealed to the extent of the conflict.

**SECTION 7:** It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance was considered was open to the public as required and that public notice of the time, place, and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the Open Meetings Act, Chapter 551 of the Texas Government Code.

**SECTION 8:** This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its passage.
